**ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE WHY A PATIENT
CARE OMBUDSMAN SHOULD NOT BE APPOINTED**

Debtors filed voluntary petitions for relief on March 9, 2025, indicating that Debtors are health care businesses. Section 333(a)(1) of the Bankruptcy Code² requires that if a debtor is a health care business, the Court will appoint, not later than 30 days after the commencement of the case, a patient care ombudsman to monitor the quality of patient care and to represent the interests of the patients of the health care business, unless the Court finds that the appointment of such ombudsman is not necessary for the protection of patients under the specific facts of the case.

Accordingly, it is

ORDERED:

1. Debtors and the United States Trustee shall appear before the Honorable Caryl E. Delano on **Thursday, March 13, 2025, at 10:30 a.m.**, to show cause why a Patient Care Ombudsman should not be appointed.

2. Judge Delano will conduct the show-cause hearing by Zoom from Courtroom 6A, George C. Young Federal Courthouse, 400 W. Washington Street, Orlando, FL 32801. Parties may attend the hearing by video or telephone via Zoom.

PARTIES MAY NOT APPEAR IN PERSON AT THE FORT MYERS COURTHOUSE.
