**ORDER SUSTAINING DEBTOR’S OBJECTION
TO CLAIM NO. 795-1 OF ALONZO FRANCISCO**

This case came before the Court upon the Debtor’s objection to Claim No. 795-1 of Alonzo Francisco (“Claimant”) [Docket No. 692]. The objection alleges that Claimant does not have a priority wage claim resulting from unpaid invoices for the shipment of consumer goods, but rather a general unsecured claim, and that the claim was filed after the claims bar date. A copy of the objection was properly served on the Claimant on April 29, 2024. No responses to the objection were received. The Court therefore considers the objection to be unopposed. It is therefore ORDERED:

1. The objection is sustained.
2. Claim No. 795-1 is disallowed in its entirety as being untimely.
